

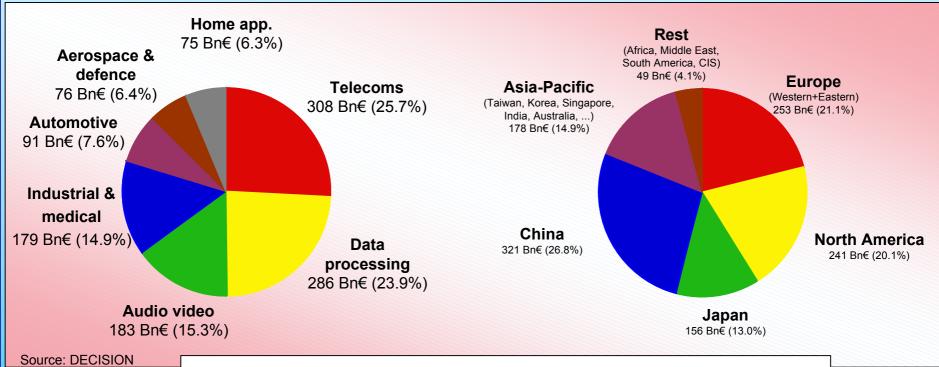

Total equipment production = € 1,198 billion

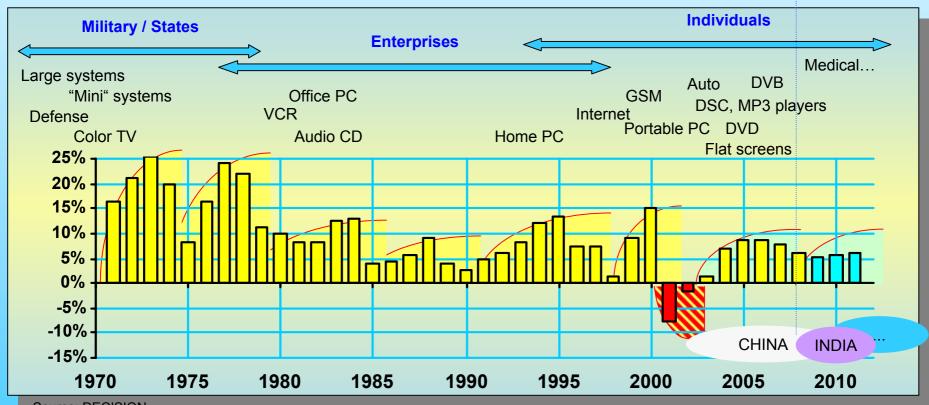
Hardware value is larger than the world 8th economy (Canada), together with IT and professional software & services electronic ecosystem is larger than Japan (world 2nd economy)!

Growth cycles of the electronics industry 1970-2011



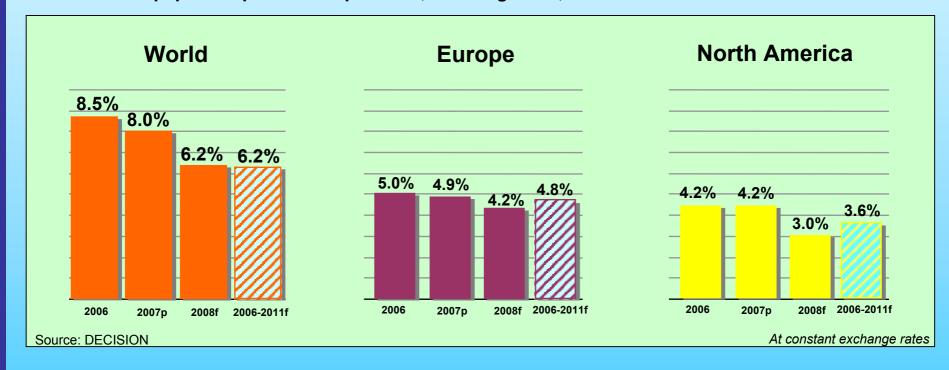

Electronic equipment: production per zone, annual growth, 2006-2011

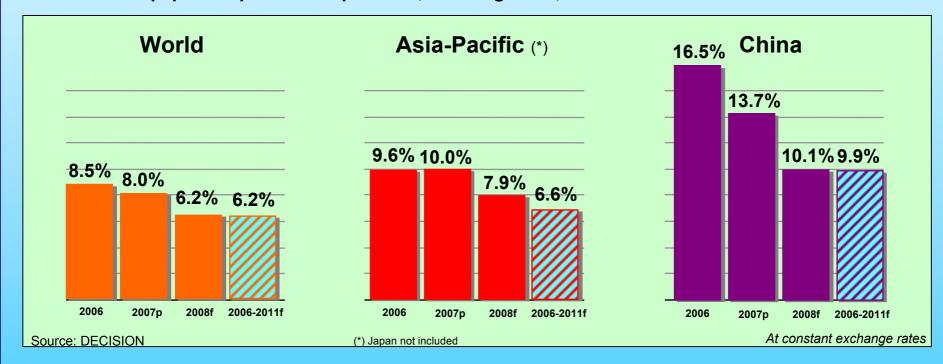






Different growth profiles for electronic production: the developing countries

Electronic Equipment: production per zone, annual growth, 2006-2011

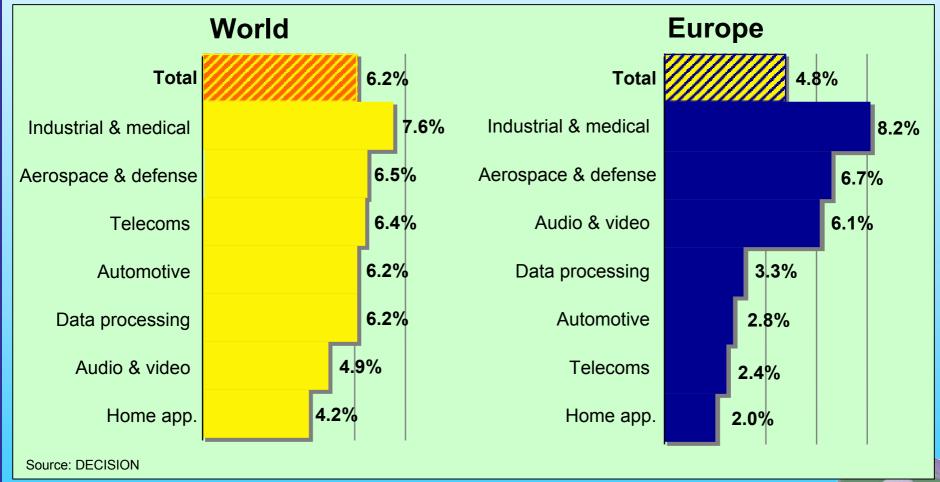

Electronics industry, Average annual growth per application sector, 2006-2011

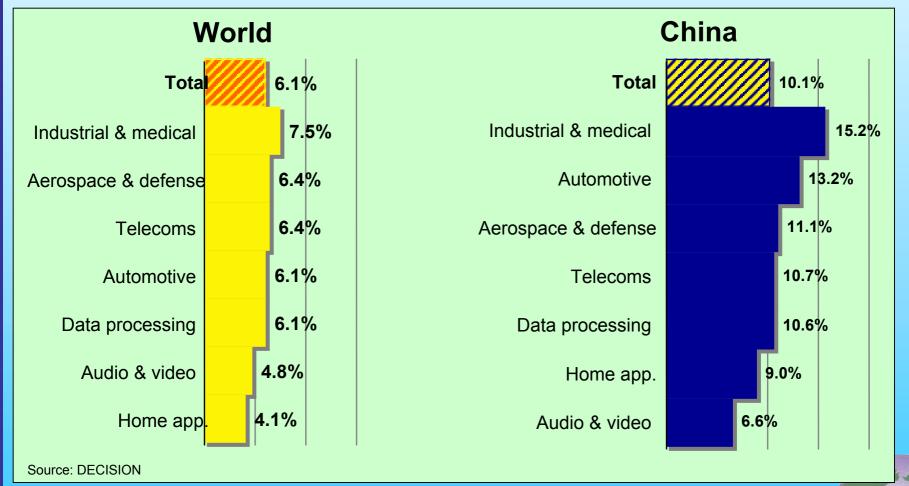

Between 2000 and 2006, China doubled its share of world electronic production from 11% to 24%!

2007-2011 evolution:

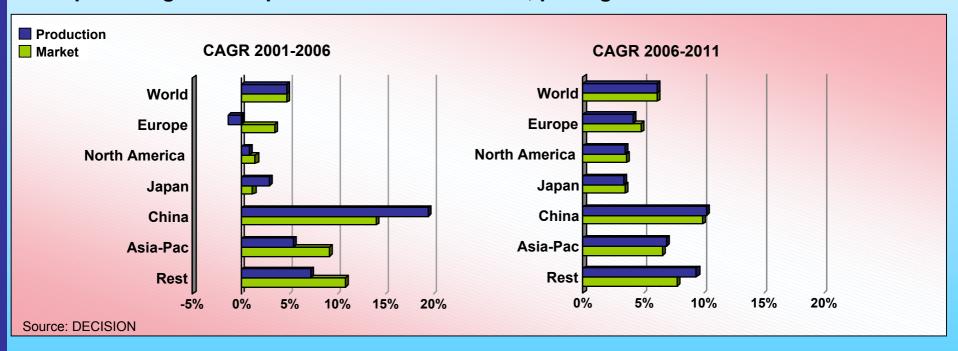
- strong focus on mass market products: 37% of world production in 2007, 41% in 2011
- some dependency in professional equipment: 17% of world production in 2007, 20% in 2011

Comparative growth of production versus market, per region 2000-2011

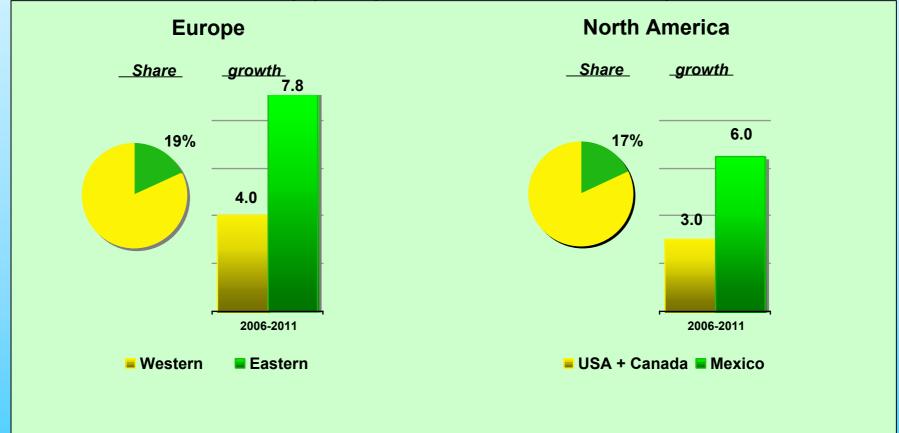

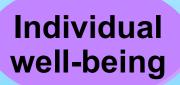
